RELEASE OF MAY 2025 EXAMINATIONS RESULTS MONDAY, 16 JUNE 2025

The President of ICPAU, Members of Council, Members of PAEB, Staff of the Secretariat, Members of the Press, Ladies and Gentlemen.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

On behalf of Public Accountants Examinations Board (PAEB), and on my own behalf, I take the pleasure to welcome you to the release of the May 2025 examinations results. This is the first of the scheduled three (3) examination diets for the 2025 examinations calendar, the other two (2) are coming in August and December 2025.

Before I go into the details of the results, there are some few, important issues that the Board wishes to highlight.

1.1 ATD COURSE REMINDER

The Board wishes to remind our continuing students on the Accounting Technicians Diploma (ATD) course that we have only one examination diet remaining — that is the December 2025 diet — before we discontinue examining the course. This implies that, come 2026, no ATD examinations will be conducted by PAEB. Those continuing ATD students who will not have completed the course at the end of 2025

will be advised to approach Uganda Business and Technical Examination Board UBTEB — now the Uganda Vocational and Technical Assessment Board (UVTAB) to work out arrangements for completing their course.

1.2 STUDENT ENGAGEMENT

We continue to implement the policy of engaging students as one of the interventions to address student performance in the various subjects of our courses. Our engagement activities are very flexible (because they are largely virtual) and are free of charge. We note that attendance is still low. Out of the targeted 7,251 candidates that registered to sit the May 2025 examinations, only 3,227 (44%) attended the students' engagements. We also note that not all the students who attended the engagement activities turned up for the examinations; only 2,104 (65%) of those who attended the engagement did sit the examinations. Further analysis shows that 842 (40%) out of the 2,104 candidates who attended the engagements passed the various papers they sat.

We, therefore, wish to call upon all students to embrace these engagement activities because they are very helpful, for students get an opportunity to interact with subject experts to share views about how to approach examinations in order to improve performance.

1.3 BRIEFING OF CANDIDATES AHEAD OF EXAMINATIONS

In a bid to help students prepare themselves better for the examinations, I am happy to report that we have also introduced briefing sessions immediately before examinations kick off. The inaugural sessions were held in the run-up to the May 2025 examinations. Being the first

time, the attendance was modest, but we are hopeful that in the future, attendance will improve, because the activities are designed to assist the students in preparing themselves better and consequently enhance their performance.

2.0 ABOUT THE MAY 2025 EXAMINATIONS

The May 2025 exams were conducted from Monday 19 to Friday 23 May 2025 at all the seven (7) exams centres of Arua, Fort Portal, Gulu, Kampala, Mbale, Mbarara and Nkozi.

A total of 6,628 candidates, (i.e. 78 ATD, 122 CTA, and 6,428 CPA) sat for the various papers representing a slight reduction of 2.46%, compared to the 6,795 candidates who sat in December 2024.

EXAMINATIONS RESULTS IN DETAIL:

(a) ACCOUNTING TECHNICIANS DIPLOMA (ATD)

The average pass rate was 41.2% compared 51.0% in December 2024. Considering the pass rate per Level, we note improvements on Level I (from 51.2% to 70.6%), while Level II and Level III registered declines in the pass rate. A further look at the performance of the individual papers, Paper 1 — Principles of Accounting registered a significant improvement in the pass rate (from 15.4% to 42.9%), while Paper 5 — Principles of Cost and Management Accounting and Paper 10 — Principles of Taxation registered a sharp decline in the pass rate, from 40.0% to 17.2% and from 58.0% to 26.8%, respectively.

The 78 candidates who sat the ATD examinations presented a total of 194 scripts, of which 118 (60.8%) were by female candidates and 76 (39.2%) by male candidates.

80 of the 194 scripts registered passes. Of these 80 scripts, 42 (52.5%) were for female candidates while 38 (47.5%) were for the male candidates.

In terms of age, 35.6% of the passes were scored by candidates in the age bracket of 18—24 years, followed by candidates in the age bracket of 25—29 years at 28.8%). The remaining 33.7% were by candidates of 30 years and above.

Of the 80 registered passes, 44 (55.0%) were scored by candidates attempting their papers for the first time.

The recognition mark for the top position for each subject/paper is a minimum of 60%. For Papers 1, 2 and 8 the highest marks were below the threshold for recognition. The female candidates dominated the top positions in the remaining papers, i.e. eight (8) out of the nine (9) positions.

Ten (10) students completed the ATD course compared to fifteen (15) in December 2024. Of the 10 students, 4 (40%) are female and 6 (60%) are male.

The cumulative number of students who have completed the Accounting Technicians course has now reached **1,882**.

As a reminder to the continuing students, the last examinations diet under PAEB will be conducted this coming December. Reminders have been sent to the students several times, and we hope they will be ready for the transition.

The average pass rate was 57.1% compared to 48.5% in December 2024. Considering the pass rates per Level, the rate on Level I remained constant at 65%, while Level II registered an improvement (from 48.5% to 57.1%). Generally, the individual subjects registered substantial improvement with Paper 9-Tax Compliance & Ethics registering the greatest improvement pass rate (from 16.7% to 75.9%). Paper 10-International Taxation is back in the limelight, having registered the lowest pass rate of 10.3%!

The 122 candidates who sat the CTA examinations, presented a total of 212 scripts, of which 121 (57.1%) registered passes. Of the 121 pass scripts, 54 (44.6%) were for female candidates while 67 (55.4%) were for the male candidates.

In terms of age, only 16.5% of the passes were scored by candidates below the 30 years age bracket and the remaining bulk of 83.5% were by candidates in the age bracket of 30 years and above.

In terms of first attempt, I am happy to report that of the 121 registered passes, 75 (62%) were scored by candidates attempting papers for the first time. This should give hope to potential students that these papers are doable!

None of the candidates for Paper 5 — Business Accounting 2 and Paper 10 — International Taxation, scored the threshold mark of at least 60% to be recognised as top candidates.

Six (6) candidates (2 female and 6 male) completed the CTA course this May 2025 sitting compared to twelve (12) in December 2024. This brings the cumulative number of students who have completed the CTA course to **106**.

The average pass rate was 36.9% compared 35.6% in December 2024. There was no significant divergence in the pass rate per level. However, considering the pass rates per subject, we note that there was a sharp decline in Paper 8 — Financial management (from 51.3% to 16.4%). The pass rate for Paper 15 — Advanced Financial Management declined by half of the December 2024 rate from 31.7% to 16.7%).

The 6,428 CPA candidates who sat the May 2025 examinations presented a total of 11,025 scripts.

In terms of gender, we had more females sitting for the CPA examinations. Of the 11,025 scripts, 6,286 (57%) were for female candidates, and 4,739 (43%) for their male counterparts.

In terms of passing on the very first attempt, 2,534 (62.2%) of the total 4,071 scripts that registered passes, were presented by candidates attempting papers for the first time.

In terms of age, performance, in descending order, was as follows:

Nine (9) (42.9%) of the 21 top positions were taken by female candidates and 12 (57.1%) by male candidates.

99 students completed the CPA course compared to 111 in the December 2024 examinations. Of the 99 students who completed the course 43 (43.4%) are female and 56 (56.6%) are male.

The cumulative number of students who have completed the CPA course has now reached **5,341**.

We would like to remind the finalists that it is not over until it is over. Completing the course is one thing, becoming a member of the Institute (or a CPA) is another. In other words, completing the course is not an end in itself but rather, a means of qualifying for membership of the accountancy profession in Uganda. We encourage the finalists to quickly take up the practical experience training (PET) as a means of paving the way to join the profession.

5.0 CONCLUDING REMARKS

PAEB congratulates all the candidates who attempted the May 2025 examinations amidst various challenges, which probably prevented a big number from attempting the examinations even after having registered to sit.

In a special way, PAEB congratulates those who managed to pass their papers, those who emerged best in different subjects and the finalists of the various courses for the milestones well achieved.

And lastly, we extend sincere thanks to our examiners, moderators, markers, invigilators, security services providers, ambulance and first aid services providers and indeed all other service providers who helped us in various capacities to successfully manage the May 2025 examinations.
